Spring Mulch Sale!

Hopefully the warm weather will soon be upon us and it will be time to make sure that our young cherry trees are given good care. It is important that we make sure that the trees do not become infested with “shot borers”. This is a small, black flying insect that literally bores into the branches and trunks of the cherry tree and feeds on the inside. Sap coming from the tree is an indication that there may be borers inside. Also, droopy leaves and unseasonable turning of the leaves is an indication of the borers presence. The older trees are not as vulnerable as the younger ones, but if they are infected, they would need to be professionally injected with an insecticide because they have such a large root base.

The younger trees, however, can be treated once or twice a year to either protect them from or to rid them of shot borers.

When the weather becomes warm is the time to treat the trees, both the new ones and the

ones that are five years old. The insecticide which has “imidacloprid” in it should do the trick. Two brand names which have concentrates of this insecticide are *Merit* and *Bayer Advanced Garden Tree & Shrub Insect Control*. A diluted portion of either one of these products should be soaked into the ground as far out as the branches go (this is the root system also); and if you do this soaking in quadrants of the tree, you’ll make sure that all areas are covered. You might want to share a bottle of the insecticide concentrate with a neighbor; and if you need any help in treating the trees, feel free to get in touch with Sarah Eresian (301.942.3753) or Dave Roth (301.933.2752). We have had a lot of water this winter, to say the least! However, if and when the Spring and Summer do become dry, it is important to water the young trees at least twice a week — both the new ones and those that are five years old. Nominating Committee
